"It was the most beautiful concert I've ever heard him play," said Briggie Hubbard, Freddie's wife of 35 years, after tearfully referencing the point how much Freddie wanted to play again after his injury.

MIRACLE OF SOLVANG

For three years (2007-2009) the Solvang Jazz Festival brought together some of the brightest jazz improvisers and composers for performances and educational opportunities in this California wine country town of artisans and craftspeople.

The festival was the brainchild of musician, composer, producer and entrepreneur 5tix Hooper and the Universal Guild for Jazz and Progressive Music Following the brilliant example of producer and impresario Norman Graza and his renowned azaz at the Philamanoic concert tours, Situ arranged the Solvang festivals to feature all-star groups in a relaxed, jam-session type of setting. The musicians were encouraged to be creative and to enjoy each other's company and talents. They most certainly did that, and as you'll hear. the results were miraculous.

For the first festival in 2007, Stix invited trumpeter Freddie Hubbard, Surrounding Hubbard in this concert are a couple of his CTI Records label-mates: percussionist Airto Moreira and flutist Hubert Laws, along with, pianist/composer Patrice Rushen, bassist Brian Bromberg, saxophonist Bob Sheppard and drummer Roy

By 2007, Freddie Hubbard was winding down a 50-year career as THE jazz trumpeter, one that fans and musicians across the world admired and learned from. Down Beat called him "the most powerful and prolific trumpeter in jazz." He'd appeared on over 300 recordings, and had worked with jazz stars like Wes Montgomery, Art Blakey, Sonny Rollins, Herbie Hancock, Quincy Jones and many more, as well as leading his own bands. He'd begun giving clinics, doing residencies and workshops for young aspiring musicians, and had been honored and presented with the National Endowment for the Arts "Jazz Masters" Award in 2006.

Freddie had survived a potentially career-ending injury to his lip in the 1990s. It changed the way he played (no more 30-chorus solos), but it didn't stop him. Dealing with a heart condition in the early years of the new century, he knew he had to adjust further, moving to more flueithorn than tumpet, continuing to play "deeper and more soulfully," as he told an interviewer at the time.

This recording is a more thoughtful, less brash Freddie Hubbard at Solvang during his performance in 2007 Each note is carefully chosen to express his emotion. He shows genuine appreciation for his bandmates for the sun in the vineyards and for the enthusiastic audience. Freddie's well-known (wicked) sense of humor was also on display along with his prodigious talent in this performance, which is one of his last appearances before his untimely death the following vear.

We're grateful to Stix Hooper for saving this particular Solvang recording to add to our remembrance of Freddie Hubbard, with the great trumpeter surrounded by good friends, great music, and plenty of laughter and love.
