I enjoyed all of my seven years as the vibraphonist with George Shearing and the quintet, but my favorite year was 1970 because that year the rhythm section included Andy Simpkins on bass and Stix Hooper on drums, George, of course, was a truly

great musician and already a legend but the addition of those two artists to the group elevated it tremendously. I was really happy when Stix came up with this tribute recording project for George and the quintet and asked me to participate and I think the results show it. On another rather interesting note (especially in these sometimes troubled racial times) Stix and I both grew up in Houston. Texas during the fifties when the south was truly segregated. Because we were both young musicians and getting into jazz we did hear of one another but were not even allowed to get together. The fact that we were able to became colleagues as well as lifelong friends is when we were finally allowed to meet and work together

in Los Angeles. This may seem bizarre now in 2016 but it's a true story. I've thought about it a lot over the passing years and feel so fortunate that in this little instance something that was very wrong was somehow able to be made very right.
